



Incompetent to Stand Trial Diversion and Community-Based Restoration Infrastructure Project

Advocates for Human Potential (AHP) is working with the California Department of State Hospitals (DSH) to support the expansion of residential housing capacity for individuals deemed incompetent to stand trial (IST).

IST Infrastructure funding is open to both California counties that execute a contract with DSH for an ongoing diversion and/or community-based restoration (CBR) programs, and non-county entities with a signed memorandum of agreement or partnership agreement with a county.



Funding Opportunity

Successful applicants will receive \$93,750 per bed which can be used for a down payment on a property to support IST infrastructure, to purchase or rehabilitate a property, for new construction, and/or for furniture and equipment. By executing a contract with DSH, counties will also receive \$228/day per individual for the provision of diversion and CBR programs for up to 18 months.



Facility Types Eligible

Residences are intended to house 6 – 10 individuals and include the following: bedrooms, bathroom facilities, shared living spaces, and access to outdoor spaces. DSH will consider a variety of licensed and unlicensed residential treatment homes and facilities, including, but not limited to supported transitional housing, board and care, adult care facilities, and recovery residences. Both locked and unlocked facilities are permitted.

- Round 1 is open to all counties and non-county entities partnering with a county.
- Counties can engage a third-party contractor or community-based organization to administer all, or a portion of their DSH IST Infrastructure Project.

Applications accepted on a rolling basis through June 30, 2024.
