Representatives from 12 counties came together recently to share next steps and considerations for awarded or soon-tobe awarded IST Infrastructure projects.

AHP hosted the January 28th Contracting Counties Forum as a space to discuss plans and progress, as well as challenges unique to counties, and collectively brainstorm opportunities and innovative solutions. Participants shared best practices and strategies around factors critical to implementation, such as garnering community support.

Attendees included Stanislaus, Butte, San Joaquin, Fresno, Humboldt, San Luis Obispo, Santa Cruz, Contra Costa, Orange, Ventura, San Diego, and Los Angeles Counties.

Advocates for Human Potential (AHP) will hold the meeting monthly to support applicants' journey from project implementation to realization and champion them along the



way.

- Book an Appointment with Your County's Grantee Liaison

Start with the **IST Support Desk**, where help is available in several ways. If a question is straightforward, it may be answered by email. If the subject is more complex, scheduling a **pre-application consultation** (PAC) or **technical assistance** (TA) call can be helpful. **Here's** the difference:

- A PAC provides assistance before an application is formally submitted. This option allows individuals to talk with a professional who can guide them through the application process and answer any questions about the grant program.
- A **TA** call may be in order for more indepth support from our team of experts in addressing a specific case or complex situation.
